Who was St. Peter?

Saint Peter, also known as Simon Peter or Cephas, holds a towering place in Christian history as the foremost disciple of Jesus Christ and the first Pope of the Catholic Church. His feast day is celebrated annually on June 29th. Saint Peter's enduring influence continues to inspire Christians, making his feast day a time of reverence and reflection on his profound contributions to Christianity.

Born as Simon in Bethsaida near Lake Tiberias, Peter's early life was that of a humble fisherman. Along with his brother Andrew, he cast his nets in the waters of Lake Genesareth until he encountered Jesus. Jesus called Peter to follow Him, promising to make him a fisher of men. From that moment, his life changed, and he became one of Jesus's closest companions.

Peter was crucified upside down, deeming himself unworthy to die in the same manner as his Lord. Emperor Constantine I later erected the grand St. Peter's Basilica in his honour.

Saint Peter is a symbol of faith, leadership, and repentance. His feast day serves as a reminder of his enduring legacy and his pivotal role in the foundation of the Christian Church.
